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Culminating Project Choices

Now that you have completed the book, choose one of the final projects to do below!

- I. <u>SEQUEL</u>: Write a sequel to <u>Bud</u>, <u>Not Buddy</u>. What happens to Bud?
- 2. <u>WHO'S THE AUTHOR?</u>: Use the Internet to do research about the author, Christopher Paul Curtis. Write a biography about him. Make sure to include a Works Cited page.
- 3. <u>DEAR DIARY</u>: Choose a character in the book. Write about the events in the book from his or her point of view, in the form of several diary entries.
- 4. <u>NEWSPAPER</u>: Create a newspaper that is themed around the events in the book. You might include articles, advertisements, comic strips, and an advice column.
- 5. <u>PLAYWRIGHT</u>: Choose your favorite scene(s) from <u>Bud</u>, <u>Not Buddy</u>. Write it in the form of a play. Either record it to show to the class, or perform it in front of the class!
- 6. <u>THE GREAT DEPRESSION</u>: Write a report or design a poster that reflects research that you do about the Great Depression. Present it to the class.
- 7. <u>NEWS INTERVIEW</u>: Imagine you are a journalist that is interviewing one of the characters from <u>Bud</u>, <u>Not Buddy</u>. Write a script for it. With a partner, either record it to show to the class, or perform it in front of the class!
- 8. <u>HOOVERVILLE</u>: Imagine that you are living in a Hooverville during The Great Depression. Write a story about life from your point of view.
- 9. <u>RULES AND THINGS:</u> In the story, Bud has a list of rules that he follows to get by in life. Create your own list of "Rules and Things."
- 10. <u>CHARACTER ART</u>: Create sculptures, puppets, or models of the characters using any material you choose. You could use a combination of paper, rocks, clay, poster board, old toys, sticks, or anything you can think of!
